The Department of Business administr--tion of SJEC organised an industry visit to the New Mangalore Port on 25th April, 2017. The final year students of MBA along with Prof. K. Manjula and Prof. Babitha Rohit visited the New Mangalore Port Trust.

A guide arranged by the CISF authority escorted the students on a short tour inside the port. The guide explained about the various berth, the various cargo shipments that were used for





import and export of goods from the port. The students got an opportunity to have a view of the liquid terminals, cruise ship and the unloading of the iron ore. After the visit inside the Warf, a talk was arranged at the Port auditorium. The speaker was Mr Navneeth Kumar, Senior Deputy Traffic Officer and Mr Suresh Babu Rtd Traffic Officer NMPT, who addressed the students and gave an in-depth lecture about the working and the achievements of the port. He provided detailed information about the 17 berths which are active in the port and listed out the items of exports and imports and he said that port is the most critical area of operation where every detail of work is to be seen, further continuing his talk he told that there are less human work and most of the work is automated leading to increased profits. He also explained about the cost incurred in every deals and how the edible oil standards are met and the time taken for it.

Continuing his lecture he told about how the management student will gain knowledge by exploring the wide world and wished the students all success. Prof K. Manjula thanked Mr Navneeth Kumar and Mr Suresh Babu for organising a very informative session on Port Management. Overall, the visit was a good experience for the students and provided them an opportunity to interact with experts in the field and received words of advice.

INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO LAMINA SUSPENSION PRODUCTS LTD, DECCAN PLAST INDUSTRIES

The Department of Business Administration at SJEC organized an Industrial Visit to Industrial Area, Baikampady - Mangaluru on 10th May 2017 for the II Semester MBA students. The planning and execution of the industrial visit was done with the help of Mr Henry Britto, President Kanara Small Industries Association (KSIA) - Mangaluru. The team of 48 students from II Semester MBA accompanied by two faculty members, Ms Shakila B & Mr Rakshith Bhandary visited three industries viz. Deccan Plast Industries, Gurucharan Industries, and Lamina Suspension Products Ltd. The visit was scheduled between 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM.



Deccan Plast Industries offer Molded Solutions of plastic molded furniture, like Premium Relax chairs, Premium Arm chairs, Premium Dining Chairs, Mid back arm chairs, Dining chairs, Armless chairs, Chairs for children, Rocker Toy for children and many more. They also manufacture Material Handling solutions which have diverse applications in fishery, food processing, Agro industry, retail shops, and many other storing and transporting applications. The team was divided into 2 groups and two officials from the company were in charge of each group and they were taken around the whole factory and shown the different plants of the entire factory. Thus the students gained practical exposure to the manufacturing process of furniture.



Gurucharan Industry was established in the year 1966 by Mr Jayakar Shettigar to manufacture Plastic Processing Machineries, Allied Machineries, and Spare Parts and Components of Plastic Processing & Allied Machineries. The students were given a close look at some of the important operations that go into the fabrication of massive and complex machine units. The manufacture of machine spare parts was demonstrated.



Lamina Suspension Products Ltd is a manufacturer of leaf springs, automobile leaf springs, grey iron castings, SG iron castings and suspension spares & parts. The students were initially taken to the mechanical testing lab where they were shown the various samples that are tested as well as the testing methods followed. Later they were taken to the actual production area where they witnessed the working of gas furnaces, mechanical and hydraulic punches, rolling, curling and flattening machines etc. that are inevitably a part of most metal forming processes. The last parts of the visit were the assembly and painting areas. The students also got the opportunity to see fully automated functions.

The industrial visit to these three industries was an enriching experience for students in getting live exposure of manufacturing which can help them in their studies and further career enhancements.

LIZZIE VELASQUEZ THE WORLD'S UGLIEST WOMAN

When she was in high school, Lizzie Velasquez was dubbed, "The World's Ugliest Woman" in an 8 second long YouTube video. Born a medical condition so rare that just two other people in the world are thought to have it, Velasquez has no adipose tissue and cannot store energy or gain weight. She ha zero percent body fat and weight just 60 pounds (approximat27kg).

In the comments on YouTube, viewers called her "IT" and "Monster" and encouraged her to kill herself. Instead, Velasquez set four goals: to become a motivational speaker, to publish a book to graduate college and to build a family and a career for herself.

Now 28 years old, she's been a motivtional speaker for more than 7 years and has given more than 200 workshops on embracing uniqueness dealing with bullies and overcoming obstacles. Her first book, "Lizzie Beautiful", came out in 2010 and second book "Be Beautiful, Be You".

Velasquez was born in San Antonio, Texas; she was four weeks premature and weighted just 2 pounds 10 ounces (1.19kg). "They told us they had no idea how she could have survived," her mother Rita told the Daily Mail. "We had to buy doll's cloths from the toy store because baby clothes were too big", doctors warned Rita and her husband Lupe, that their oldest child would never be able towalk or talk, let alone live a normal life. Her two younger siblings were not affected by the syndrome.

Instead she was thrived. Her internal organs, brain and bones developed normally, though her body is tiny. Since she has no fatty tissue in which to store nutrients, she has to eat every 15 to 20 miutes to have enough energy to getthrough the day. One brown eye started clouding over when she was 4 years old and now she is blind in that eye and has only limited sight in the other.

She notes her triumphs and posts inspirational messages on Tumbler and says that she's learned to embrace the things that make her unique. Instead of trying to retaliate against people who have made her feel badly, she sets goals for herself and pushes herself to succeed in spite of the haters. She's even reclaimed YouTube, video blogging about everything from bullying to hair styling tips to staying positive.

"I'm human and of course these things are going to hurt," she said. "Their judgements on me isn't who I am, and I'm not going to let these things define me".

"I didn't sink down to their level," she said in a follow up video on YouTube last year. "Instead, I got my revenge through my accomplishments and determination. In the battle between the 'World's Ugliest Woman' video v/s Me, I think I Won".


