General Aptitude Entrance Examination for BBA and BCA

General Guidelines and Detailed Syllabus

1. This entrance examination is conducted for admission to the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) programs.
2. The question paper will consist of Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQs).
3. The questions will be based on the 10+2 (PUC / equivalent) level syllabus.
4. The question paper will consist of the following sections.:
 - a. Quantitative Aptitude
 - b. Logical Reasoning
 - c. Verbal Ability (English)
 - d. General Knowledge
 - e. Analytical Ability
5. Each question will have four options, of which only one option is correct.
6. Candidates are required to select the most appropriate answer for each question.
7. The duration of the examination will be 45 minutes.
8. The total number of questions will be 30.
9. Each correct answer will carry one mark.
10. There will be no negative marking for incorrect answers

11. Detailed Syllabus:

Module-1 Quantitative Aptitude

Number system, percentages, ratio and proportion, averages, profit and loss, simple and compound interest, time and work, time–speed–distance and data interpretation using tables and charts.

Module 2- Logical Reasoning
Number and letter series, analogies, classification, coding and decoding, direction sense, blood relations, syllogisms, puzzles, and logical arrangement
Module-3 Verbal Ability (English)
Basic grammar, vocabulary, synonyms and antonyms, sentence correction, sentence completion, reading comprehension, error identification, and para jumbles.
Module-4 General Knowledge
Current affairs, Indian history, geography, Indian polity, basic knowledge of Indian economy, important personalities, national and international events, and basic science and technology.
Module 5- Analytical Ability
Data interpretation, logical analysis, critical reasoning, problem solving, decision making, case-based analysis, pattern recognition, and information analysis.
